Welcome,	Welcome and Introductions began at 10:05AM
Introductions and, Announcements	CDPH and the State Office of AIDS contracted with OCH to initiate a program that gives 50 dollars to patients who are engaged in a care program and receive the MPOX vaccine. Patients who reengage in the care program will receive up to 100 dollars for getting the MPOX vaccine. Providers were encouraged to share this information with the patients they serve. Strength in Numbers is a brotherhood that provides a forum for people living with HIV to come together for a sense of mutual strength and support. The organization hosts meetings at the LGBT Center.
Public Comments- Action Items	N/A
Agenda Review*	The January agenda was presented for review and approval. Kane Ortega motioned to accept the agenda as presented and Zach Basler seconded the motion. The following changes were made to the agenda. The FY23 Part B monthly report will not be included for discussion. The facilitator should be changed to Kristina Kendricks-Clark because Richard Benavidez is excused. Under Committee updates, the vote on the Waiver of the 10% directive is an action item that will be voted on so there should be an asterisk next to it. Kane Ortega motioned to accept the agenda with the changes made and Zach Basler seconded the motion. The motion passed with a majority. See vote sheet
Minutes Review*	The December minutes were presented for review and approval. Jake Bradley-Rowe motioned to accept the minutes as presented and Lenore Gotelli seconded the motion. The following changes were made. Keshia Lynch needs to be added the attendee's list. On page four under SOA Ending the HIV Epidemic, the statement should read "Site staff were impressed with the services that the Sacramento County of Public Health is providing"

	Under Priorities and Committee Updates, the FY23 Reallocation should be removed as an action item. Jake Bradley-Rowe motioned to accept the minutes with the changes made and Kane Ortega seconded the motion. The motion passed with a majority. See vote sheet.
OA Voice January 2024 Update	There are 200 PreP-AP enrollment sites and 188 Clinical Provider sites that make up the PrEP-AP Provider Network. Strategy J of the OA Voice highlights that there is an increase in rates of insurance/benefits coverage for People Living with HIV (PLWH) or on PrEP. Strategy M talks about a report on the Epidemiology of HIV in California, 2017-2021. This report describes the state of the HIV epidemic in California over the specified five-year period, including trends in new diagnoses and progress towards viral suppression as well as the impact of social determinants of health on new diagnoses and health outcomes. This report also includes information regarding the care of HIV patients in California and HIV prevention among vulnerable populations. The CDPH is seeking to add two or more committee members living with HIV to serve as community advocates on the Medical Advisory Committee (MAC). CDPH wants the MAC to be reflective of the communities impacted by HIV.
Presentation Facente Consulting	Sara Duran from Facente Consulting gave a presentation on the Strategic Plan and Implementation Blueprint. California Department of Public Health partnered with Facente Consulting to develop a strategic plan to address inequities and disparities in healthcare. Sacramento and six other counties are coauthors of the Strategic Plan and Implementation Blueprint. The plan has 30 strategies across six Social Determinants of Health with activities under each strategy. The objective is to adopt a de-siloed innovative problem-solving through traditional and non-traditional partnerships. Sacramento will adopt the Strategic Implementation Blueprint Plan tailored to Sacramento's needs.
	The Strategic and the Implementation Blue Print Plan identifies HIV, HCV, and STI as a syndemic. A syndemic is a condition with similar root causes that exacerbate each other.

	Approaching the plan through a syndemic lens ensures that impacted populations have access to services that provide holistic support. The Strategic Implementation Blueprint Plan is intended to be used as a tool to develop a plan that aligns with the County's needs. While it is impossible to address all the challenges associated with racial inequities, housing, mental health and substance use disorders, and economic injustice, developing partnerships with stakeholders who work to address these issues will help create new approaches to improve outcomes.
HIV/STI Prevention Updates	A CDC grant application was submitted to support clinical services and funding for community agencies. If awarded, the funding will begin on June 1. The Prevention team is awaiting a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for HIV prevention plans via the State Office of AIDS which will start on July 1. The prevention team had a strategic planning session and hired a new Health Educator. Lindsay Parks assumed the Sexual Health Manager position in January.
FY23 December Part A Monthly Fiscal Report*	The FY23 year to date monthly fiscal report was presented for review and approval. All invoices processed from the last cutoff date of Friday, January 19, are reflected in the report. \$25,000 worth of invoices have been processed since Monday, January 22. The expenditures should be at 83.3% through December 31. The current TGA spending for El Dorado County is at 68% and TGA spending for Placer County is at 62.7%. The current TGA spending for Sacramento County is at 65.6 %. The overall direct expenditure for the Sacramento Transitional Grant Area (TGA) is 65.53%. Recipient expenditures are at 61.33%. The TGA Part A Direct Service Expenditures are at 63.98% and Part A MAI Direct Service expenditures are at 90.88%. If the remaining unobligated balance exceeds 5%, the Recipient could lose \$1.3 million in supplemental funding and the ability to have Carryover funding in the future. Ronnie Miranda motioned to accept the year to date Part A Monthly Fiscal report and Jake

	Bradley-Rowe seconded the motion. The motion passed with a majority. See vote sheet for details. See vote sheet for details.
SOA Ending the HIV Epidemic Update	A new grant application was submitted to HRSA as part of Ending the HIV Epidemic on January 16 for funding to support clinical services and community agencies.
HRSA Ending the Epidemic	There will be federal site visits on March 12, 13, and 14. During the site visit, federal regulators want to hold two meetings with affected community stakeholders and other community stakeholders.
Committee Updates	
AdAC	The next AdAC meeting is on June 13. It is a closed meeting as attendees need to sign a confidentiality agreement before attending.
Affected Communities Committee	The first two Community Conversation Meetings will be held on March 13 and May 19. The meeting on March 13 will focus on HIV women and girls the meeting on May 29 will focus on HIV and the transgender community. All meetings will be held at the LGBT Center from 6:00PM 7:00PM.
Reflectiveness	Reflectiveness is at 34.3%. The ACC is looking to fill open transgender and Native American seats.
Priorities and Allocations Committee FY23 10% directive*	PAC met Jan 3 2024. The Priorities and Allocation Committee recommended waiving the 10% limitation on the recipient to move funding without Council prior approval. This would give Chelle Gossett full authority to re-allocate funds across all service categories for FY23 to make sure the most money is spent as possible. Ronnie Miranda motioned to accept the PAC recommendation to give Chelle Gossett full authority to reallocate funding across all service categories and Lenore Gotelli seconded the motion. The motion passed with a

	majority. See vote sheet for details.
Quality Advisory Committee	QAC will meet on March 5, 2024.
Needs Assessment Committee	The NAC will meet on March 5, 2024. The Needs Assessment report will be a topic of discussion in the March meeting.
Executive Committee	Annual member acknowledgements were sent to Council members and should be completed and signed and returned to Angelina Olweny. Council members also have to complete form 700.
AdHoc	AdHoc will meet virtually on February 20 from 1-2PM. The focus of this committee will be housing and community involvement. The County has a new Public Information Officer. Chelle Gossett will follow up on the topic of a new website.
Governance	Governance looks for Council leadership to address issues from the committee. There are currently no legislative or regulatory changes that will affect HHSPC.
Vote on Council Chair	Richard nominated himself for the Council Chair position. Richard Benavidez offered to mentor a different candidate if they were selected. The Council unanimously voted to approve Richard Benavidez for another term as the Council Chair.
Binder Update	There will be new updates in the coming months.

Public Comments Non-Agenda Items	A guest at the Council meeting stated that clients who receive Oral Healthcare through Ryan White funding need dental coverage for implants and dentures. They stated that currently, most Ryan White recipients are being referred to dentists who do not accept Ryan White dental coverage. As a result, clients use temporary solutions for dental issues that could be harmful because they are choking hazards. It was explained that Ryan White funding doesn't cover implants or dental procedures not typically covered by other governmental assistance programs such as Medi-Cal. Oral Healthcare is a service category funded under the Ryan White Program however, there are limits to the dental services that can be covered under the program as it is federally mandated. Information was shared regarding the current state of oral healthcare in this country and that typically not even the best of dental insurance plans covers implants. It was recommended that advocates for improved oral healthcare coverage reach out to their legislators to bring the issue to their attention. A Council member stated that they could not get their calls returned when seeking information on rental assistance. A representative from OCH offered to be a point of contact for the individual so that they could receive the help they needed. Harm Reduction Services is hosting an HIV Black Awareness Day on February 7 from 12:00 PM – 4:00 PM at their location. There will be raffles and \$10 incentives for people who get tested for HIV.

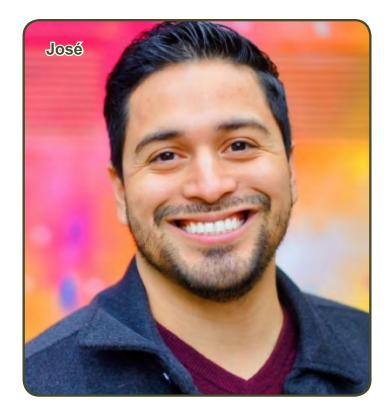

STAFF HIGHLIGHT

OA would like to welcome José Emmanuel Vega (He, Him) to the OA Prevention Branch, where he will provide both fiscal and programmatic support to the Harm Reduction Unit. Jose will be the lead for the Harm Reduction Supply Clearinghouse, which provides a baseline level of supplies to the 72 syringe services programs in CA. And he'll be our contracts expert, guiding us through the process of developing scopes of work and budgets for our many projects.

José is a dedicated health educator, ACE's advocate, and administrative professional with a passion for public health, LGBTQ+ issues, harm reduction, and community development. José is passionate about the inclusion of diversity, health equity, eliminating homophobia / transphobia, and sexual health education. Holding a degree in health administration with a minor in communications, José motivates and inspires others to become involved and improve their community's health by amplifying voices and sharing his network with marginalized communities.

José and his team in Oklahoma helped open and start Tulsa's first walk-in PrEP clinic, followed by his assistance in California in opening South Sacramento's first community HIV, STD, and PrEP resource testing center. There, he added Covid testing and vaccines in the midst of the 2020 Covid Pandemic, along with launching



at-home HIV testing and rapid PrEP virtual navigation. At the start of the Mpox pandemic in the summer of 2022, José assisted the Oklahoma Health Department in Tulsa's rapid response vaccine center in partnership with the Dennis R. Neill Equality Center. Together they managed to vaccinate 400 patients in two months, educating the community and physicians about the virus, thereby helping reduce the spread of Mpox in Tulsa County.

José continues his work in public health as a disease intervention trainer, volunteering as a contributor for the Pornhub Sexual Wellness Center website, and providing education on HIV,

STD, PrEP, and Doxy-PEP. In his free time, Jose enjoys the Cinema experience - you can find him at the movies every weekend, hiking when weather is amazing, cuddling with his chihuahua (Pebbles), and eating Thai food – his favorite.

ENDING THE EPIDEMICS STRATEGIC PLAN

Implementation of the *Ending the Epidemics Strategic Plan*, which replaces our *Laying a Foundation for Getting to Zero: California's Integrated HIV Surveillance, Prevention, and Care Plan* (Integrated Plan), is on-going.

The <u>Strategic Plan</u> has 30 strategies organized over 6 social determinants of health and its accompanying <u>Implementation Blueprint</u> helps us drill-down into these strategies. HIV AWARENESS

February 7th is National Black HIV/AIDS
Awareness Day (NBHAAD). NBHAAD was
established in 1999 as a grassroots-education
effort to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS
prevention, care and treatment in the Black/
African American community. NBHAAD is
celebrated to promote HIV education, testing,
and community involvement among Black
communities. The theme this year is "Engage,
Educate, Empower: Uniting to End HIV/AIDS in
Black Communities".

Although black communities have made progress in reducing HIV, they are significantly

impacted by social and structural determinants of health such as racism and medical mistrust. These and other factors affect whether Black people seek, receive HIV treatment or are aware of life saving measures such as Pre-exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP).

According to CDPH HIV Surveillance data, in 2020 Black/African Americans make up approximately 6% of California's population however, they account for 17% of living HIV cases and 17% of newly diagnosed cases. A factsheet depicting demographics and health outcomes for this community has been made available.

In honor of NBHAAD, engage, become empowered and get tested.

We have partnered with the Division of Communicable Disease Control (DCDC), a program within the Center of Infectious Diseases and have disseminated a number of documents in an effort to keep our clients and stakeholders informed. Mpox digital assets are available for LHJs and CBOs.

OA is thrilled to announce the **Mpox Vaccine Incentives Program** – a new patient benefit available for a limited time. Rates of mpox

infections in California have declined but not gone away. As people with HIV have been more susceptible to severe mpox infections, now is the time to improve protection in the community with the highly effective mpox vaccine. This program allows clinics to request a vaccine incentive gift card for people with HIV who are receiving their first or second dose of JYNNEOS. The program is open to clinics that provide HIV care and is expected to run until June 30, 2024.

Now that the Emergency Declaration has ended and the COVID-19 response is winding down, we are re-initiating our integration discussions and moving forward with the necessary steps to integrate our HIV, STI, and HCV programs into a single new Division. We will continue to keep you apprised on our journey!

Ending the HIV Epidemic

Reminder: We have expanded our OraQuick HIV self-testing program to all counties in California through the <u>Building Healthy Online</u>

Communities: Take Me Home program (BHOC-TMH). This is a collaboration between BHOC-TMH, CDPH, and local health departments. The program puts an effective, free HIV screening tool directly into the hands of Californians who request it via the TMH website. Outreach for this program is automated mostly through advertising on dating apps and websites.

There are plenty of resources allocated in this program through June 2025. Please help market it through your own social media using these tools in English and in Spanish. They can be used as part of your organization's social media or printed out with your information to co-brand the program.

Also, a special thank you to the California Planning Group (CPG) and other Planning Councils, Commissions, and Groups across California who have been integral partners in the review, improvement, and implementation of our Ending the HIV Epidemic work and the <u>Ending the Epidemics Integrated Statewide Strategic Plan</u>.

Improve Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) Utilization:

▶ PrEP-Assistance Program (AP)

As of January 31, 2024, there are 200 PrEP-AP enrollment sites and 191 clinical provider sites that currently make up the <u>PrEP-AP Provider</u> network.

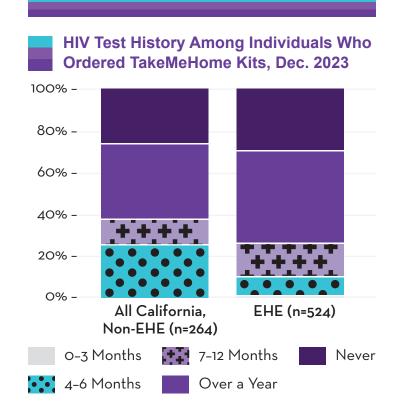
STRATEGY B

Increase and Improve HIV Testing:

As we mentioned previously, OA continues to implement its BHOC-TMH self-testing program to allow for rapid OraQuick test orders in all jurisdictions in California. The program, TakeMeHome®, (https://takemehome.org/) is advertised on gay dating apps, where users see an ad for home testing and are offered a free HIV-home test kit.

In December, 264 individuals in 37 counties ordered self-test kits, with 184 (69.7%) individuals ordering 2 tests. Additionally, OA's existing TakeMeHome Program continues in the six California Consortium Phase I Ending the HIV Epidemic in America counties. In the first 40 months, between September 1, 2020, and December 31, 2023, 8896 tests have been distributed. This month, mail-in lab tests (including dried blood spot tests for HIV, syphilis, and Hepatitis C, as well as 3-site tests for gonorrhea and chlamydia) accounted for 290 (55.3%) of the 524 total tests distributed in EHE counties. Of those ordering rapid tests, 142 (60.7%) ordered 2 tests.

STRATEGY G

Improve Availability of HIV Care:

OA's HIV Care Branch is looking for a new Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Program provider for Solano County. Request for Application (RFA) #24-10015 was released on February 2, 2024, and posted on our website.

HOPWA provides housing assistance and supportive services to prevent or reduce homelessness for persons living with HIV (PLWH). Local government entities (e.g., health departments, housing authorities, or community development agencies) and non-profit community-based organizations may apply. The award amount for Solano County is approximately \$416,343 per year.

OA will host a <u>technical assistance webinar</u> through MS Teams on February 12, 2024 (11

STRATEGY K

Increase and Improve HIV Prevention and Support Services for People Who Use Drugs:

▶ RESEARCH: Health Risks Associated with Smoking Versus Injecting Fentanyl

The Journal Drug and Alcohol Dependence published a study conducted by RTI International that suggests that people who injected fentanyl were at higher risk for overdose and skin and soft tissue infections than people who only smoked fentanyl. It is the first study to report associations between different methods of fentanyl administration and health care outcomes in the U.S. Findings suggest that distribution of safe smoking supplies may facilitate transitions from injecting to smoking fentanyl, thereby reducing health risks associated with fentanyl use.

FY23 3rd QUARTER RECIPIENT REPORT

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

By November 30, 2023, the Sacramento Transitional Grant Area (TGA) served 2,035 unduplicated clients; compared to 2,153 in FY22. In FY23, the largest age group at 34.10% are clients between the ages of 25-44. The majority of individuals (87.03%) reside in Sacramento County.

Most notably, the TGA assisted 155 <u>new (never been served in the TGA) clients</u>. These are new clients in the TGA, which are the counties of Placer, El Dorado and Sacramento as well as Yolo. During the same period last year, the TGA served 196 new clients.

There is a disproportionate impact of HIV/AIDS among African Americans in the TGA. Although they make up only 7.5% of the TGA's general population, African Americans represent 22.70% of the TGA's HIV/AIDS Prevalence (people living with HIV/AIDS) and their representation in the Ryan White system of care is currently 24.86%, 2.16% higher than their HIV/AIDS prevalence as of December 31, 2021. Also of note is the representation of the Hispanic caseload in the Ryan White system of care. As of November 30, 2023, Hispanics accounted for 27.22% of the caseload or 6.52% higher than their HIV/AIDS prevalence of 20.7%. Thus, these two populations continue to be a priority target for outreach in the TGA, and current caseloads indicate the TGA has been successful in bringing and keeping their population in care.

As of November 30, 2023, 67.72% (1,378 clients) of the Ryan White clients in the Sacramento TGA had income ranges between 0 to 138% of the Federal Poverty Level. This is a slight increase over the prior year of 69.77%.

Of the Ryan White clients served by November 30, 2023, males are the primary gender group (80.93%) living with HIV/AIDS. Likewise, Men Having Sex with Men (MSM) is the most reported mode of transmission at 59.21%.

The Recipient continues to meet the various reporting requirements and deadlines set forth by the United States Health and Human Resources Administration. The Recipient maintains a delicate balance meeting the federal and state reporting requirements, assisting and contracting with providers, staffing the Planning Council and responding to inquiries from consumers.

The Recipient continues to experience barriers in data acquisition. Program staff have been working closely with County I.T. to modify and correct the data import system which sends data from the SHARE system to ARIES and the new system replacing ARIES, HCC. These various projects require on-going oversight to ensure data integrity. The County has been working to correct the data integrity issue. The recipient has been working on making various upgrades to SHARE to better analyze Medical Performance Indicators by service category, client demographics, and funding stream to better assist in CQM activities.

BARRIERS TO CARE:

Housing remains a constant struggle for clients, a 2023 article¹ from CNBC reports that an individual making \$75,000 a year in the greater Sacramento area, would have a maximum home budget of \$275,880 and that there are only 2.6% of listings available at that price margin. Another 2023 article² on housing from SFGate states that the Sacramento median home price is \$475,000, up 38% from 2019. The article explains that many people have moved from the Bay Area to Sacramento since the COVID-19 pandemic and "In 2020 alone, migration between San Francisco County and Sacramento County grew 70% from the

previous year". This migration puts a further burden on the already overwhelmed system of care in the region and increases the competition for finding affordable housing.

A 2023 report³ from the California Budget and Policy Center described that "There are disparities in experiences of homelessness by gender identity and sexual orientation. In terms of gender, the majority of unhoused Californians are male. Individuals who identify as transgender or gender-nonconforming are more likely than cisgender individuals to be unsheltered when they experience homelessness. Among youth, those who identify as LGBTQ+ are especially likely to experience homelessness".

UTILIZATION AND TRENDS IN CARE:

<u>New Clients</u>: During the three quarters of Fiscal Year 2023, the TGA served 155 new unduplicated clients. Eight (8) of the clients reside in Placer County, five (5) clients in Yolo, six (6) clients in El Dorado County, and the other 136 reside in Sacramento.

In comparison, during the three quarters of Fiscal Year 2022, the TGA served 196 new unduplicated clients. Fourteen (14) of the clients reside in Placer County, twelve (12) clients in Yolo, eight (8) clients in El Dorado County and the other 162 reside in Sacramento.

In FY23, 49.98% of the clients (1,017) reported to be at 100% or below the Federal Poverty Level. In comparison in FY22, 52.35% (1,127) of the clients reported being at 100% or below of the Federal Poverty Level.

• Clients by Transmission: As of the end of the third quarter in FY23, Men Having Sex with Men (MSM) continue to represent the highest transmission level at 59.21%, with heterosexual transmission (27.67%) and Intravenous Drug Use (9.83%) the most common transmission methods.

Whereas, at the end of the third quarter in FY22, Men Having Sex with Men (MSM) continued to represent the highest transmission level at 56.85%, with heterosexual transmission (30.10%) and Intravenous Drug Use (9.89%) the most common transmission methods.

RECIPIENT BARRIERS:

The Recipient continues to evaluate its existing systems for improvements in reporting and to produce tools that can be used to track clients and improve health outcomes. Our funders require us to provide multiple reports throughout the project period. Finding a more efficient way to capture data would relieve some of the reporting burden for the entire TGA. Current projects include making various updates to SHARE to better analyze Medical Performance Indicators by service category, client demographics, and funding stream to better assist in CQM activities.
