FY22 Reallocation Memo*	<p>Chelle Gossett Presented the FY22 Reallocation Memo. It was determined that \$110,569 was available for reallocation of the requested \$233,806. The recommendations included:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Reallocate \$6,500 to the Outpatient Ambulatory Care Service category in Sacramento County 2. Reallocate (\$31,331) from the Oral Health Care Service category in Sacramento County 3. Reallocate \$54,069 to the Medical Case Management Service category 4. Reallocate \$3,500 to the Non-Medical Case Management Service category 5. Reallocate \$40,000 to the Mental Health Service category 6. Reallocate \$6,500 to Medical Transportation Service category 7. Reallocate (\$42,000) from the Substance Abuse-Outpatient Service category 8. Reallocate (\$5,000) from Substance Abuse-Residential Service category 9. Reallocate (\$8,838) from Child Care Service category 10. Reallocate (\$11,000) from Medical Nutrition Therapy Service category 11. Reallocate (\$12,400) from Outreach Service category 12. There was a request to remove all of the funding (\$10,821) from the Health Insurance Cost Sharing Assistance. It was recommended the funding remain in this category as the funding has typically been spent in November, December, and January. <p>Richard Benavidez motioned to accept the FY22 Reallocation Memo as presented and Ronnie Miranda seconded the motion.
