CPG/HIV/STI Prevention Updates	California Planning Group is planning on releasing a strategic state plan for ending the HIV epidemic. CPG is also planning on releasing an infographic on HIV and aging.
FY23 March Part A Monthly Fiscal Report* FY23 March Part B Monthly Fiscal Report SOA Ending the HIV	The FY23 March Part A Monthly Fiscal report was presented for review and approval. The report only encompassed the first partial funding award from HRSA. The March Fiscal Report shows early expenditures for March. There were outstanding invoices for labs and transportation and rural medical case management at the time of the Planning Council Meeting on June 28 th . Administrative Assessment Committee AdAC Overview*	Melissa Willet acknowledged attendees of the AdAC committee meeting on June 15 th and gave a brief overview of the results from the FY22 year-end review. The next AdAC meeting will be on November 16 th 2023 to hold the FY23 mid-year review The AdAC Overview was presented for review and approval. Changes made included updating the Committee Staff person contact information. Melissa Willet motioned to accept the AdAC

Affected Communities Committee	The PrEP Community Presentation highlighted the fact that 1 in 10 people knew what PrEP was. PrEP can be prescribed to minors from the ages of 12 years and up and there is funding to support the distribution of PrEP. Zach Basler suggested that committee members inform their clients about the Community Conversation events at the LGBT Center to boost attendance. There will be a meeting on July 19 th at 6:00 PM that will be focused on ending the HIV epidemic. Reflectiveness is at 33%. The goal is to have more representation of women, transgender individuals, and Native Americans living with HIV.
Priorities and Allocations Committee FY24 Priorities* PAC Overview* Quality Advisory Committee	The PAC Committee presented their recommendations for the FY24 priorities for review and approval. They recommended to leave the service priorities for FY24 the same as the 2023 priorities because the committee put a lot of thought into consumers' needs when they determined those rankings and made quite a few changes to the prior years. However, they are open to revisiting the service priorities if needed. Richard Benavidez motioned to accept the FY24 service categories as presented, and Kane Ortega seconded the motion. The motion passed with a majority. Please see the attached vote sheet for details. The PAC overview document was presented for review and approval. It had a change of
	contact information to Angelina Olweny at Valley Vision. The meeting schedule was adjusted to reflect that no meetings will be held in July. Kane Ortega motioned accept the PAC Overview as presented and Dennis Poupart seconded the motion. Please see the attached vote sheet for details.
FY22 Post Card Survey Findings	The FY22 Post Card Survey Findings were presented for informational purposes. It gives important feedback regarding each service category provided by the Ryan White Program. The County received 236 returned postcard surveys with a 17.3 percent response rate. Committee members shared ideas about how to increase the survey response rate. One possible way is to

	share information about the survey in a bulleted document and encourage clients to complete the survey and inform them about the importance of the postcard survey.
FY22 Client Satisfaction Survey Findings	The FY22 Client Satisfaction Survey Findings were presented for informational purposes. Clients gave feedback about agency specific satisfaction on services received from Ryan White providers. Feedback included verbatim comments from clients and providers were encouraged to share the results with their staff.
Needs Assessment Committee	The FY22 Needs Assessment report was presented for informational purposes. The information included in the report highlighted the services with the greatest need and the greatest unmet need. The highest ranked service for unmet need was oral health. The Needs Assessment confirmed that the top funded service categories are in line with the highest need service categories. Lili Joy asked that members reach out to her and provide recommendations on future service needs that could reframe the information collected.
FY22 Needs Assessment Report	A question was asked as to whether the Needs Assessment addressed the needs of women with HIV. It was pointed out the Needs Assessment covered all gender demographics. The Needs Assessment Committee shared that they plan to conduct a mini-needs assessment on the HIV and Aging population for FY23.HIV and aging is a topic that needs to be spotlighted because the social determinants of health reveal that there is an unmet need in this population. There are discussions about how to address the service need of the aging HIV population and the committee hopes this mini-assessment will provide insight on what services this population will need.
Executive Committee	The updates from the various committees were discussed in the last executive committee meeting.
Ad Hoc Work Group	The Ad Hoc workgroup shared that they have been looking at ways to improve the council's website and have discussed social media strategies to increase awareness and recruitment.

Governance GOV-01 Committee Development* GOV-10 Officer Elections	The Council was presented with Governance-01 and Governance-10 documents for review and approval. The changes were indicated in red. Zach Basler motioned to accept the Governance 01 document as presented with a second from Melissa Willett. The motion passed with a majority. older who meet <u>PrEP-AP eligibility criteria</u>. Color Health will be adding services for minors (12-17 years old) in a future update. Individuals can visit <u>Color Health's webpage</u> to set up a secure account, get help enrolling in PrEP-AP, and access PrEP-AP services remotely.

Color Health's trained PrEP-AP Enrollment Workers will work with clients to enroll in PrEP-AP and any required pharmaceutical assistance program. Color Health's providers will conduct timely telehealth visits to assess clients for PrEP or PEP clinical eligibility and provide prescriptions which can be filled at <u>PrEP-AP</u> Magellan Rx network pharmacies.

PrEP-AP clients accessing services through Color Health will have the option to order a self-testing kit to the address of their choice or visit a lab in their area to conduct necessary labs for PrEP and PEP initiation and maintenance.

STRATEGY B

Increase and Improve HIV Testing:

OA continues to implement its Building Healthy Online Communities (BHOC) self-testing program to allow for rapid OraQuick test orders in all jurisdictions in California.

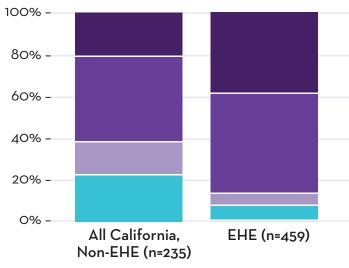
TAKEMEHOME

The program, <u>TakeMeHome</u>, (https://takeme home.org/) is advertised on gay dating apps, where users see an ad for home testing and are offered a free HIV-home test kit.

In June, 235 individuals in 35 counties ordered self-test kits, with 204 (86.8%) individuals ordering 2 tests. Additionally, OA's existing TakeMeHome Program continues in the six

California Consortium Phase I Ending the HIV Epidemic in America counties. In the first 34 months, between September 1, 2020, and June 30, 2023, 6545 tests have been distributed. This month, mail-in lab tests (including dried blood spot tests for HIV, syphilis, and Hepatitis C, as well as 3-site tests for gonorrhea and chlamydia) accounted for 258 (56.2%) of the 459 total tests distributed in EHE counties.

STRATEGY F

Improve Overall Quality of HIV-Related Care:

OA is postponing the HIV Care Connect (HCC) go-live date until April 2024 to accommodate the following factors, as requested by service providers:

- Start using HCC after completing the 2023
 Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Services
 Report (RSR) report in ARIES. This will allow
 a smooth transition and avoid any disruption
 to the reporting process.
- Accommodate HCC Import functionality changes and provide the technical XML schema file before go-live date. This will allow providers to setup their internal systems to meet HCC Import requirement.

Some advantages of a later go-live date include allowing more time for development and thorough testing of HCC functions, such as reports, budget/invoices, duplicate merges, and the import processes; and avoid burdening RWHAP service providers with learning a new system (HCC) while under the pressure of completing the 2023 RSR. STRATEGY G

Improve Availability of HIV Care:

The California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) will release its draft of the 2022-23 Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) for public comment prior to submittal to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The CAPER reports on specified federal housing and economic assistance allocated by the state, which includes the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) program, for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023.

The CAPER draft will be available on <u>HCD's</u> website at https://www.hcd.ca.gov/policy-and-research/plans-and-reports, for public comment from September 1 through September 17, 2023 at 5 PM PST. <u>Questions and public comments</u> can be submitted to CAPER@hcd.ca.gov. Increase and Improve HIV Prevention and Support Services for People Who Use Drugs:

Stimulant Safety: Getting Amped Up to Reduce Harms When Using Stimulants

A new guide created by the National Alliance of State and Territorial AIDS Directors (NASTAD) Drug User Health aims to educate individuals and organizations that provide services to people who use methamphetamine and other stimulants to help reduce stigma, minimize harm, and improve services for people who use drugs. FY23 1st QUARTER RECIPIENT REPORT

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Sacramento Ryan White Program (encompassing Sacramento, Placer, El Dorado, and Yolo County) served 1,383 unduplicated clients during the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2023; compared to 1,642 in FY22. In FY23, the greatest numbers of Ryan White clients in the program are between the ages of 25-44 (34.42%), with the majority of individuals (86.26%) residing in Sacramento County as well.

Most notably, the program assisted 64 <u>new (never been served in the program) clients</u>. These are new clients in the program, which are the counties of Placer, El Dorado, and Sacramento as well as Yolo. During the same period last year, the program also served 67 new clients.

There is a disproportionate impact of HIV/AIDS among African Americans in the program. Although they make up only 7.5% of the programs' general population, they are 22.70% of the programs' HIV/AIDS Prevalence (people living with HIV/AIDS), and their representation in the Ryan White system of care is currently 22.78%. Of note is the representation of the Hispanic caseload in the Ryan White system of care. For the first quarter of 2023, Hispanics accounted for 27.62% of the caseload, or 6.92% higher than their HIV/AIDS prevalence of 20.70%. Thus, these two populations continue to be a priority target for outreach in the program, and current caseloads indicate the program has been successful in bringing and keeping their population in care.

During the first three months of FY23, 69.77% (965 clients) of the Ryan White clients in the Sacramento Ryan White Program had income ranges between 0 to 138% of the Federal Poverty Level. This is a slight decrease over the prior year of 70.52%. It is to be noted that FY23 figures were calculated using FY22 poverty guidelines.

Of the Ryan White clients served in the first three months of FY23, males are the primary gender group (86.26%) living with HIV/AIDS. Likewise, Men Having Sex with Men (MSM) is the most reported mode of transmission at 61.32%.

The Recipient continues to meet the various reporting requirements and deadlines set forth by the United States Health and Human Resources Administration (HRSA). The Recipient maintains a delicate balance in meeting the federal and state reporting requirements, assisting and contracting with providers, assisting with the Planning Council needs, and responding to inquiries from consumers.

Housing remains a constant struggle for clients, a 2023 article¹ from CNBC reports that an individual making \$75,000 a year in the greater Sacramento area, would have a maximum home budget of \$275,880 and that there are only 2.6% of listings available at that price margin. Another 2023 article² on housing from SFGate states that the Sacramento median home price is \$475,000, up 38% from 2019. BARRIERS TO CARE:

Housing remains a constant struggle for clients, a 2023 article¹ from CNBC reports that an individual making \$75,000 a year in the greater Sacramento area, would have a maximum home budget of \$275,880 and that there are only 2.6% of listings available at that price margin. Another 2023 article² on housing from SFGate states that the Sacramento median home price is \$475,000, up 38% from 2019. The article explains that many people have moved from the Bay Area to Sacramento since the COVID-19 pandemic and "In 2020 alone, migration between San Francisco County and Sacramento County grew 70% from the previous year". This migration puts a further burden on the already overwhelmed system of care in the region and increases the competition for finding affordable housing.

A 2023 report³ from the California Budget and Policy Center described that "There are disparities in experiences of homelessness by gender identity and sexual orientation. In terms of gender, the majority of unhoused Californians are male. Individuals who identify as transgender or gender-nonconforming are more likely than cisgender individuals to be unsheltered when they experience homelessness. Among youth, those who identify as LGBTQ+ are especially likely to experience homelessness".

UTILIZATION AND TRENDS IN CARE:

• New Clients: During the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2023, the TGA served 64 new unduplicated clients. Two of the clients reside in Placer County, one in Yolo, one new client in El Dorado County and the other 60 reside in Sacramento.

In comparison, during the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2022, the TGA served 67 new unduplicated clients. Five of the clients reside in Placer County, four in Yolo, seven in El Dorado County and the other 51 reside in Sacramento.

TOTAL CLIENTS:

The following data is as of May 31, 2023. There was a total of 1,383 unduplicated clients receiving services in the Sacramento Transitional Grant Area. There were 1,642 clients during the same reporting period the prior year.

In FY23, 51.48% of the clients (712) reported to be at 100% or below the Federal Poverty Level. In comparison in FY22, 53.04% (871) of the clients reported being at 100% or below of the Federal Poverty Level.

• Clients by Transmission: As of the end of the first quarter in FY23, Men Having Sex with Men (MSM) continue to represent the highest transmission level at 61.32%, with heterosexual transmission (25.24%) and Intravenous Drug Use (10.41%) the most common transmission methods. There was almost a 5% decrease in heterosexual transmission in the first quarter of FY23 compared to FY22.

Whereas, at the end of the first quarter in FY22, Men Having Sex with Men (MSM) continued to represent the highest transmission level at 56.21%, with heterosexual transmission (29.72%) and Intravenous Drug Use (10.60%) the most common transmission methods.

It should also be noted that the top three methods of transmission rankings remain the same (1-MSM, 2-Heterosexual, and 3-IDU).

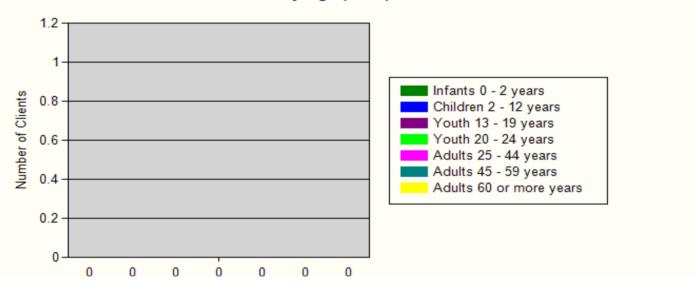

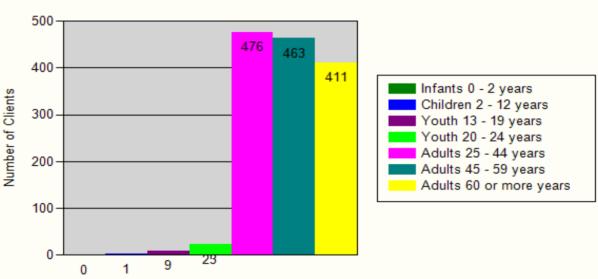

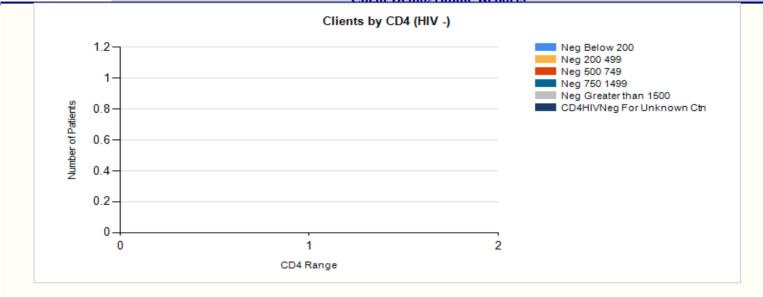

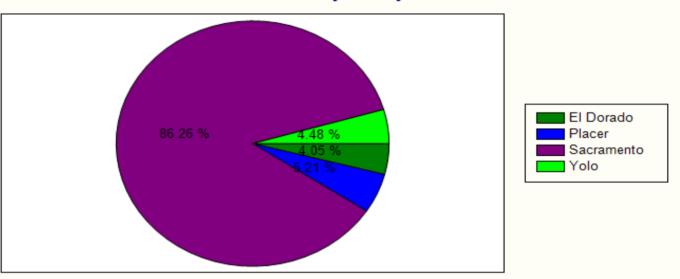

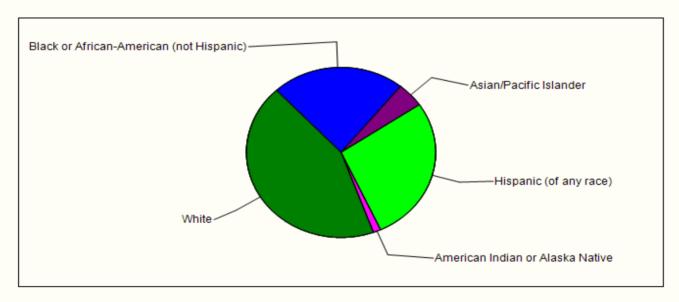

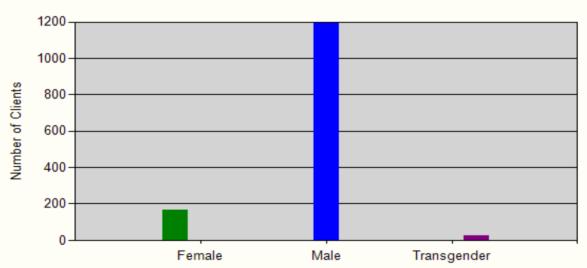

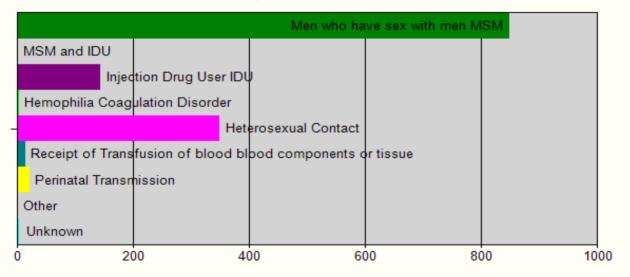
