FY20 Reallocation Request*	The Fiscal Agent discussed the recommendations distributed prior to the meeting. There was a total of \$281,665 in reallocation requests. Upon reviewing expenditure rates, it was determined that \$216,783 in reallocation requests was justified.
	Oral Health, a core service, in Sacramento County is under-spending due to COVID- 19 service closures. However, both El Dorado and Placer Counties can benefit from an increase in Oral Health funding at this time.
	There was a request for an increase in funding for MAI (Minority AIDS Initiative) Medical Case Management. However, that is a set funding stream from HRSA and the category itself cannot be increased. Rather, it is recommended that the requested increase be applied to Field-based Medical Case Management which also services people of color.

	Zach B. inquired if this is the only time reallocation is conducted each fiscal year? No, there is a second reallocation at year-end in efforts to spend down the grant. HRSA (U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration) has a limit of 5% for carryover in any given year. If the 5% is exceed, sanctions are imposed which results in less funding.
	Motion to approve the Fiscal Agent's recommendations as outlined in the memo was made by Zach B. with a second by Liane Bruckstein and approved with one abstention.
Technical Assistance	Susan Farrington advised members that if they are in need of technical assistance, members can reach out to the Council Chair, Committee Chair, Fiscal Agent or Council Staff for assistance.
Public Comments	Susan Farrington advised that she has sent personal letters to Kamala Harris and Diane Feinstein regarding the 5% carryover limitation as it relates to COVID-19 and the services being shut-down due to the pandemic.
	Ronnie Miranda reminded everyone to vote.
	Zach Reau reminded everyone that One Community Health has detox substance abuse treatment services available.
	Jake Bradley-Rowe reminded everyone that if they have families in need of childcare assistance, to send referrals to Sunburst Projects. Chelle Gossett further reminded people of the WICY (women, infants, child and youth) requirement which is impacted by childcare services.
