	Motion to approve October Minutes as presented was made by Ronnie Miranda with a second from Richard Benavidez. Discussion noted the following corrections.
	On page 4 under the heading "Affected Communities Committee: instead of "purpose higher education" it should read "Pursue Higher Education".
	On page 5 under the heading "U.S. HIV/AIDS Conference Report Back" CVID" is misspelled, it should be spelled "COVID".
	Motion to approve the amendment Minutes was made by Dennis Poupart with a second from Richard Benavidez and approved by consensus.
Recognition Event	Dr. Law, Michael Gagnon, Tracy Jenkins, Robin Learned, Ronnie Miranda, Dennis Poupart, Kane Ortega, Linda Ryan and Judy Vang are recognized for their participation on the Planning Council. Their seats are set to expire on December 31, 2020, but have been submitted for reappointment, with the exception of Michael Gagnon, who has resigned to pursue higher education.
Vice Chair Elections	Richard Benavidez assumed the Vice Chair position two years ago when the prior Vice chair vacated the position with a year remaining on the term of service. However, an oversight occurred and the position was not re-elected last year. Therefore, the election of the Vice Chair position is being brought back. The Vice Chair will take over when Kristina Kendricks-Clark, the Council Chair, is unable to attend meetings
	A discussion ensued as to whether or not to hold the election during this meeting or table the election until the next meeting. In addition to Richard Benavidez wish to continue as vice chair, Zach B. and Dennis Poupart expressed interest in the position, the election will be held at the January Council meeting. Office of AIDS (OA) Update December 2020	Tracy Lee with the State Office of AIDS provided an overview of the December OA Voice Update which included updates on World AIDS Day and Strategies A, B, J, K, L, M, and N. Strategy J addresses rates of Insurance/Benefits Coverage for PLWH or on PrEP. The Office of AIDS hosted a webinar targeting non-medical case management providers and improving comprehensive healthcare. As the State Office of AIDS is not tracking insurance in their ARIES database, SHARE will be updated to capture the necessary information to be reported in ARIES.
	Richard has a suggestion that the phrase "Latin X" be changed to and to be used from now is the pronoun "LATINX", everyone agreed this will now be the correct verbiage. His concern is how the current pronunciation makes him feel like an ex Latino. Latinx is more appropriate and falls more in line with all other cultural pronunciations.
	Ronnie Miranda inquired if there were any updates on the COVID-19 Vaccines. As of this time have, Tracy Lee has no information.
Fiscal Agent Reports September 2020 Monthly Fiscal Report*	Chelle Gossett provided an update on the September 2020 Monthly Fiscal Report. The allocations do not reflect reallocation changes as we are waiting to update SHARE once all the contracts have been signed by providers. El Dorado County is presently underspending. Placer County is on target with medical case management expenditures. Sacramento is underspending by approximately 9%. Jake Bradley-Rowe, with Sunburst Projects, noted that this monthly report is through September and that they have increased spending in the past two months. Beth Valentine, with Volunteers of America, stated that they have been spending down funds as well. Motion to approve the monthly report as presented was made by Susan Farrington with a second by Kristina Kendricks-Clark and was approved by consensus.
	Chelle Gossett reported that the State Office of AIDS' Ending the HIV Epidemic (EtHE) most recent draft was reviewed by the Executive Committee. It includes a Wellness without Walls initiative which highlights a mobile van to provide HIV services to people living with HIV, as well as, a U=U Undetectable = Untransmittable media campaign.
	Chelle Gossett provided an update on the HRSA Part A EtHE grant. The Board of Supervisors has approved the additional positions and "build out" of the Sexual Health Clinic to provide Ryan White HIV medical

Committee Updates  FY20 Performance Outcomes*	<b>Administrative Assessment Committee (AdAC):</b> Susan Farrington, AdAC Chair, stated the Committee met and reviewed the Fiscal Agent's FY20 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> Quarter work. This meeting was entirely virtual. Staff did an excellent job conducting the Zoom meeting and presenting the various documentation virtually. There were no negative findings. Site Visits have been suspended by HRSA. The year-end review will be held on June 11, 2021.
	<b>Affected Communities Committee (ACC):</b> Richard Benavidez, ACC Chair, informed that Reflectiveness is presently 38.6%, exceeding the mandated 33.3% requirement. The Committee anticipates the next Positive Advocate newsletter will be released next month.
	<b>Priorities and Allocations (PAC):</b> Susan Farrington, PAC Chair, advised that PAC did not meet in December. It will not be meeting in January at this point either as there is no business to conduct.
	<b>Prevention Committee:</b> Susan Farrington, Prevention Committee Chair, advised that the Committee met and are looking for other PrEP Navigator groups to join, forming a more effective Committee.
	Quality Advisory Committee (QAC): Paula Gammell, Council Staff, advised that QAC met and reviewed the FY20 Performance Outcomes which are presented for approval. Changes included a change to the Housing Quality Performance Indicator #2 regarding Improved or stable housing. Due to a reduction in housing programs in the region, the indicators was reduced from 85% to 60% of clients surveyed who are receiving housing assistance will report improved or stable housing. Additionally, the indicator has not been compared to prior years and so that language will be deleted from the indicator as well. The other change was a change in terminology in Outpatient Ambulatory Care. <i>In Medical Care</i> has been changed to <i>Receipt of Care</i> to sync with the National HIV/AIDS Strategy update. Motion to approve the FY20 Performance Outcomes as discussed was made by Dennis Poupart with a second by Kristina Kendricks-Clark and approved by consensus.
	QAC also discussed the FY20 Service Category Post Card Survey. The goal is to survey 25% of the clients receiving services in any service category. Post Cards are being mailed to Providers for distribution.
	Needs Assessment Committee (NAC): Paula Gammell, Council Staff, advised that NAC met and discussed

	the FY20 Needs Assessment focusing on treatment age youth, ages 18 –24. It was determined that the Survey should be revised to shorten the survey for the target population. Additionally, the target population is small, approximately 50 – 60 individuals, thus rendering some of the information unnecessary as it would be statistically insignificant.
	<b>Governance:</b> Michael Ungeheuer extends his apologies for being unable to attend the Council meeting. The Committee has no pending assignments.
