What does Latinx mean?

Spanish is a gendered language, meaning that the masculinized version of words is considered gender neutral. Using an "x" is a way of rejecting the gendered version of a word. Latinx becomes a gender-neutral alternative to Latino, Latina and is gaining popularity among the general public as part of a "linguistic revolution" that aims to be inclusive of the intersecting identities of Latin American individuals. In addition to men and women from all racial backgrounds, Latinx also makes room for people who are trans, queer, gender non-conforming or gender fluid.

What is HIV Vaccine Awareness Day?

This day is a chance to thank the volunteers, community members, health professionals, and scientists working together to find a safe and effective preventive HIV vaccine. It is also a time to educate communities about the importance of preventive HIV vaccine research.
