The guidance, which was developed collectively by the HHS Antiretroviral and Opportunistic Infections Guidelines Panels, working groups of the Office of AIDS Research Advisory Council, is intended for health care providers and persons living with HIV in the United States.

Preventing the Spread of Germs

Practice every day preventive actions to help stop the spread of respiratory viruses:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough.
- Sneeze into a tissue then throw the tissue away in the trash. Wash your hands afterwards.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Get a flu shot.
- Avoid wearing contact lenses
- If you are feeling ill, with any symptoms, stay home from work or school until free of symptoms a minimum of seven days from the start of symptoms
- Maintain social distance at least six feet and avoid handshakes or hugs.
- If you or your child have a fever or cough, do not visit elderly family members.
- If you are elderly, or in the high risk category, avoid going into public spaces or hosting visitors.
- If you are 60 years old or older, and/or if you have an underlying chronic medical condition or compromised immune system (see explanation below), you should avoid large gatherings such as conferences, social meetings, and/or sporting and entertainment events for example, basketball games and concerts.
