According to the Covered California website, by March 31, 2014, more than 3 million Californians enrolled in insurance plans or Medi-Cal. While enrollment in Covered California plans is closed until the next open enrollment in October 2014, Medi-Cal enrollment is open year-round.

Presently, there are over 750 Certified Enrollment Entities and over 750 additional Enrollment Entities are going through the Certification process.
