The Sacramento TGA Ryan White Part A **HIV Health Services Planning Council** is seeking new volunteer members!

What is the Planning Council?

The Sacramento HIV Health Services Planning Council is a group of volunteers who work to improve the quality of the lives of people living with HIV/AIDS in the Sacramento Transitional Grant Area (TGA) which includes Sacramento, Placer and El Dorado Counties.

The Planning Council sets priorities, plans services and allocates federal funding to HIV/AIDS service categories. In 2016, the Planning Council made recommendations on allocating approximately \$3 million for services for people living with HIV/AIDS in the Sacramento TGA.

Reflectiveness

Reflectiveness includes making sure that the planning council membership overall and the consumer members are similar to the demographics of people living with HIV/AIDS locally (for example, race, ethnicity, age). This is called reflectiveness. Particular attention is paid to including people from disproportionately affected and historically underserved populations. Planning councils must also include people with specific expertise and backgrounds. This is called representation.

Seeking

The Sacramento TGA HIV Health Services Planning Council is seeking people living with HIV/ AIDS for membership of any race, ethnicity or gender. However, the Council is underrepresented for females living with HIV/AIDS and for those of Hispanic ethnicity. Additionally, the Council is under-represented of people living with HIV/AIDS who identify as Asian, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander or American Indian/Alaska Native. Applicants from the underrepresented Reflectiveness requirements are given top priority. Transportation assistance can be provided for people living with HIV/AIDS.

Ryan White Services and Funding

The Sacramento TGA's HIV Health Services Planning Council's Priorities and Allocations Committee (PAC) establishes funding priorities and allocations for Ryan White funding. The Committee is comprised of people living with HIV and representatives of various community based organizations. PAC is tasked with creating funding recommendations for Grant Applications, annual funding allocations, and annual reallocation of funds.

PAC is seeking people living with HIV/AIDS to assist in this process. The Committee meets on the second Monday of each month (unless otherwise notified) from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the Sacramento County Primary Care Center, 4600 Broadway (corner of Stockton and Broadway), Conference Room 2020, Sacramento, CA 95820.
